TRIPS

Exploring the Best of Italy / September 18 - 28, 2023



The title of this trip certainly lived up to its name. Forty-four members departed on September 17 on a trip to Italy that included visits to the Tuscany region including Pienza and Florence as well as Cinque Terre in the Ligurian area of northwest Italy. We had 10 glorious days of sunshine, 80-degree weather and no rain.



It was truly a trip that included planes, trains, buses, and boats. The trips activities not only were punctuated with visits to ancient churches, Abbeys, and museums but also olive and wine estates where we sampled many varieties of wines and olive oil. We also had the opportunity to hunt for truffles (sort of, since dogs now replace pigs that once detected truffles and did the digging.). But we detected quite a few that were prepared and included in the pasta we had for lunch.

Of course, everyone enjoyed "the David" in Florence, as our guide, Giorgio, called him. We had a structured tour on the first day when we visited the major attractions: the Santa 3 Croce Church, Piazza Della Signoria with Palazzo Vecchio, Duomo with the Baptistery and Tower, ending at the Galleria dell 'Accademia to see the Statue of David. We also had a free day in Florence where some visited museums, some climbed the Bell Tower and some the Dome. While eniovable and memorable the crowds were intense. Seems everyone traveling these days. Some members sought help from our guide for a side trip to the Tower of Pisa. Giorgio gladly complied, arranged, and accompanied some members to the tower. We did a lot of walking in Florence as there was a lot to see and buses are not permitted in the inner city. According to my Garman we walked 17,000 steps one day and 18,000 the next.

Most if all I think everyone loved our Santa Margherita hotel with a view of the sea and near to the Cinque Terre (Meaning 5 lands or villages each connected by paths and trains). Probably the highlight, some would say, was the train to Corniglia and the hike from there to Vernazza, two of the villages. Starting with ascending over 350 steps we began our hike up and down narrow, rocky paths. The view of the sea was stunning and the hike exhilarating. And everyone I talked with was proud they completed the 2 ½ hour trek but probably wouldn't do it again. It was a challenge.





Kitzbuhel Austria, with two days in Innsbruck Feb 9th - Feb 19th


