Yes, we did encounter COVID on all the international trips (Caribbean, France, Scotland & Italy) and we had some issues with airlines and hotels, but all in all our travelers had a good time. They have submitted their trip surveys and we have compiled the data so we can put together future trips for our membership that are even better. Thank you so much to all our 2023 Travelers.

I get excited every time I think about our list of Adventure Trips for 2024. Currently we have seven trips scheduled and all of them are international. #### STATEMENT FROM THE RSAC BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

"Regarding the scheduled Egypt / Nile River Cruise in April 2024, the Adventure Trips Director (Bob Strickland) has been in continuous contact with our trip operator at Alpine Adventures to monitor the ongoing situation in Israel and the Gaza Strip as well as the entire Middle East Region. The safety of our RSAC travelers is of utmost importance to Bob and the RSAC Board. We continue to evaluate our contractual and financial commitments to this trip so we understand all of our options. A decision to cancel or postpone this trip until April 2025 must be made by December 1, 2023. This information has been shared with all of our Egypt Trip participants. We want all of our participants to know that Bob and the RSAC Board are respectful of their concerns."


